



PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT

PERMIT NUMBER -PER8959

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Product to be used:

DUPONT STEWARD INSECTICIDE

Containing: 200 g/L INDOXACARB (25:75) as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Linseed	<i>Helicoverpa</i> spp.	400 mL/ha
Safflower	(budworm, native budworm, bollworm, heliothis, corn ear worm)	

Critical Use Comments:

Apply by aerial application or by ground rig. Apply according to DuPont Steward Insecticide label, ensuring all spray drift management instructions are followed.

Target brown eggs and hatchings (neonates or 1st instar) to small larvae (2nd instar) when economic spray threshold reached and before larvae become entrenched in pods.

DO NOT apply by ultra low volume methods.

Withholding Period:

Harvest : DO NOT harvest for 4 weeks after application.

Grazing and cutting for stock food: DO NOT graze treated crops or cut for stock food for 4 weeks after application.

LIVESTOCK DESTINED FOR EXPORT MARKETS

The grazing withholding period only applies to stock slaughtered for the domestic market. Some export markets apply different standards. To meet these standards, ensure that in addition to complying with the grazing withholding period, that the Export Slaughter Interval is observed before stock are sold or slaughtered.

EXPORT SLAUGHTER INTERVAL – 4 weeks: After observing the grazing withholding period, livestock that has been grazed on or fed treated linseed or safflower forage/hay/stubble should be placed on clean feed for 4 weeks prior to slaughter.

Jurisdiction:

NSW, SA only.

(Note: Victoria is not included in this permit because their 'control-of-use' legislation means that a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in VIC).

Additional Conditions:

This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.
