



PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT

PERMIT NUMBER - PER8661 (re-issue)

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Product to be used:

DUPONT STEWARD INSECTICIDE
Containing: 150 g/L INDOXACARB as its only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Sunflower seed production (<i>Helianthus annuus</i>)	<i>Nysius</i> spp., Rutherglen bug (<i>N. vinitor</i>) and Grey cluster bug (<i>N. clevelandensis</i>)	Apply 400mL product per hectare.

Critical Use Comments:

Apply as required against above threshold pest densities. Multiple spray may be required due to low threshold and long period of susceptibility.
Apply by aerial or ground rig.

Withholding Period:

DO NOT HARVEST FOR AT LEAST 28 DAYS AFTER LAST APPLICATION.

Jurisdiction:

NSW, QLD, VIC, NT and WA only.

Additional Conditions:

1. THIS PERMIT provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.
2. PERSONS who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.
3. TO AVOID CROP DAMAGE:
The sensitivity of some species and varieties of the crops to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable, therefore, to only treat a small number of plants to ascertain their reaction before treating the whole crop.
4. FATE OF PRODUCE FROM TREATED PLANTS
Produce, stubble etc from treated plants (including failed crops) must not be supplied to or otherwise made available for human or animal consumption.
